

Institutional Seminars

The Department regularly conducts seminars for the trainees to hone their research skills, inculcate the skills of observation and presentation of research findings in a logical manner, remove fear of public speaking and prepare them for higher education. Two in-house seminars, the first on **9**th

September, 2017 on the theme 'Education for Sustenance of Democracy' and the second on **17**th **October, 2017** on the theme 'Parenting: Challenges of the 21st Century' were organized in the Department. The trainees presented their research papers on various issues related to the focal theme of the seminars. Each presentation was followed by a brief discussion on the topic with the audience. The best papers that were awarded were 'Connecting Teachers' and Students' Strategies for Success of Inclusive System of Education' and 'Adolescence Cybercrime and Social Media'.



Microteaching Workshop
